

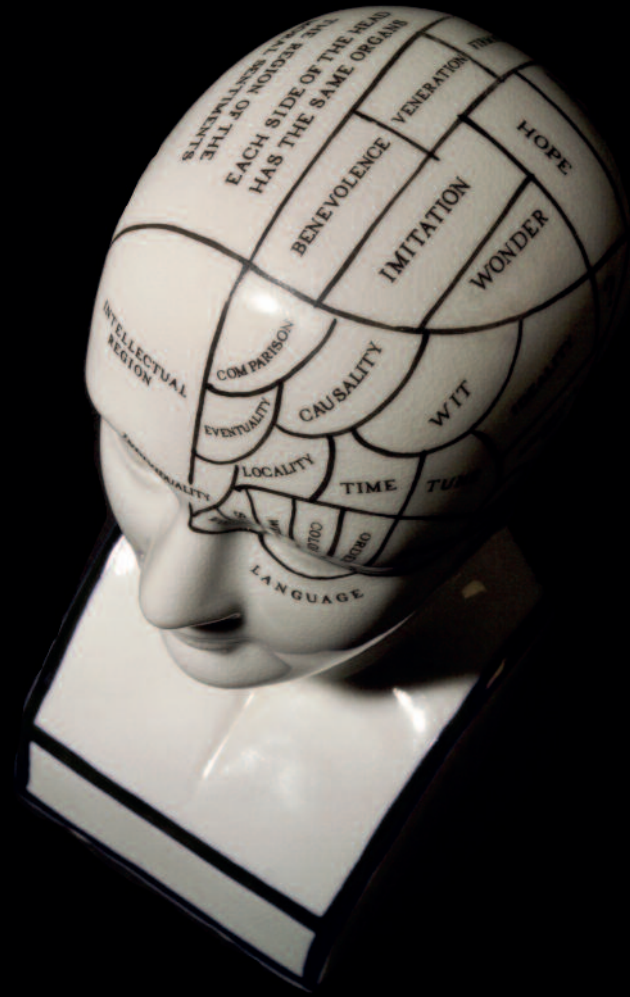

In particular we will be taking an in-depth look at problems and solutions in dealing with mentally ill people within the workforce. 12KBW's expert team of barristers will be joined by other specialists in this area. We will also cover religious beliefs and their potential conflicts with equality and diversity legislation.

Finally, Andrew Hogarth QC, Head of Chambers and a former Employment Judge will round off the conference by exploring the issues raised by 'third-party' harassment of employees and the roles and responsibilities of employers.

Programme

Mental Illness in the Workplace

Session 1 – Disability Defined

What is a disability will be considered from both the legal and medical angles. One of our barristers will discuss the ever expanding definition of disability whilst our guest consultant psychiatrist will look at the types of mental illness to be found in employees.

Session 2 – Integration in the Workplace

The need to make reasonable adjustments to accommodate those with disability is well known. How to establish whether adjustments might be reasonable will be discussed by our barrister. Our guest vocational rehabilitation consultant will review what options for adjustment there may be.

Session 3 – Dismissal from the Workplace

The difficulties faced by employers in dismissing disabled workers fairly will be examined together with the value of remedies available to the employee who has been unfairly dismissed.

Session 4 – Conflicts with Religious Beliefs

How do the rights of those wishing to espouse their religious beliefs fit in with their responsibilities under today's equality and diversity legislation?

Session 5 – Third Party Harassment

Protecting employees who deal with the public from abuse has never been more difficult. We look at what could and should be done by employers to look after their workforce.
